Engaging our audiences – achieving our YCW goals.

Children

Goal: To advance climate literacy and engage and empower children (7-14yrs) to take action

Teachers

Goal: To support teachers and educators to improve climate literacy and opportunities for climate action.

Families & community groups

Goal: To encourage families to learn about climate change, take carbon-cutting actions and make sustainable living choices, inspiring societal behavioural change.

Young People

Goal: Supporting young people (14-23yrs) in building skills to become future 'green changemakers'.

In 2024/25 we reached over 14,900 children across our four programmes. Sharing our inspirational climate-related resources we're empowering children to take action whilst encouraging reflection and discussion about sustainable-living choices. With a 'stubborn optimistic'* ethos, we focus on igniting curiosity, building critical-thinking skills, sharing positive solutions, getting 'out into nature' and motivating a shared responsibility for the well-being of our planet.

Educators have a crucial role to play in building climate-literacy amongst children. In all our conversations with teachers we witness a passion to bring a hopeful message to their pupils. Increasing expectations and ever-expanding curriculums however mean they simply don't have the time to prepare resources to engage young people in climate conversations. This is where we step in. Providing inspiring resources our goal is to ease the burden on teachers, whilst also driving the change we strive to see.

St Matthew's Primary School, Leeds

In 2024/25, Young Climate Warriors engaged with schools all across the UK, from Glasgow to Cornwall, reaching over 14,900 children across all our programmes. Climate change is already impacting us all, but these impacts are not experienced equally. Vulnerable communities, the urban poor, and those already experiencing poverty are – and will continue to be – disproportionately affected, and children from disadvantaged backgrounds feel the impacts most strongly. At Young Climate Warriors, we are driven to ensure that our work is open and available to all. This year, 38.6% of the schools we have engaged with have greater than average 'free school meal eligibility', and we are continuing to prioritise schools in areas that rank more highly against the Multiple Deprivation Index, ensuring that we are doing everything we can to support children from all backgrounds across the UK.

Beneficiaries	What we have achieved this year
Supporting children aged 7-11yrs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Shared 47 Climate Assemblies building climate literacy across the UK, reaching 8,959 children, from Edinburgh to Cornwall, from Liverpool to Kent. Our bespoke YCW movie looks at our incredible natural world, and the basics of climate science, prompting discussion on 'what' climate change is, 'why' it's happening, 'how' we can take action and 'who' can take action (... everyone!) Our passionate, dynamic YCW Ambassadors act as positive role models, share our 'climate ditty', and run our interactive sustainable-living game - 'what's in the bag'?
Supporting young people aged 18-23yrs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 55 young people trained as YCW Ambassadors, recruited from 24 towns/cities across the UK. Our YCW Ambassadors build their climate knowledge, and channel their passion and climate-concern into a tangible community project. Ambassadors develop skills in climate oracy and public-speaking, building a platform to become confident potential future 'green changemakers'.

Adel Primary School, Leeds: YCW Ambassador, Kate, shared our Climate Assembly in February - she was 'warm, friendly and confident, the content was pitched well, and presented so that all pupils could access it'. In April, Kate returned to inspire their newly established eco-club by sharing two of our 'CCC in a Box sessions' - 'Understanding climate change' and 'Environmental footprints: recycling and inspiring curiosity' ... these in turn spurred on the eco-club to undertake a school environmental audit, following which they recorded some creative eco-messages that they shared with the whole school ... an excellent example of how YCW encourages and empowers action at school!

DofE Climate Skills Challenges



Three months of climate challenges, supporting DofE participants to develop sustainable-living skills via practical guided activities.

Beneficiaries	What we have achieved this year
Supporting young people aged 14yrs+	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Supported 63 Duke of Edinburgh Bronze/Silver participants on a 'climate journey' building a deeper capability set for climate action and sustainable living. Through 13 weekly challenges, with personalised email support, young people strengthen their critical thinking skills and develop their values framework based on a shared planetary responsibility. 100% say they will continue changes such as shorter showers, eating less meat and buying less.
Supporting wider communities - family and friends	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Intergenerational engagement strengthens climate action. Feedback shows 99% of participants discuss their climate challenges with family, teachers, friends or relatives, extending our reach into wider communities.

Fighting fast fashion: 80% of 16-24-year olds can't remember what clothes they own — can you? Can fashion be 'cheap, cool and kind to nature'? What is the circular economy and can it help combat fast fashion? Our YCW challenges spark debate and stimulate critical thinking. This challenge also encourages seeing clothes as part of a 'portable memory box' ... restoring them to new life where possible. Climate Change Club in a Box



Ready-to-use, zero cost small group resources. Designed to build climate literacy & stimulate deeper sustainable-living discussions.

Beneficiaries	What we have achieved this year
Supporting teachers	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Feedback from our Teachers Advisory Panel informed the re-design and update of CCC in a Box resources. 12 new CCC in a Box sessions launched on Earth Day - 22nd April 2025. Our CCC in a Box resources can be used in a whole class session, or as part of an eco-club, and each session includes detailed teachers notes. 93 schools requested our CCC in a Box resources in 2024/25
Supporting children aged 7-14yrs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> YCW Ambassadors have to date followed our Climate Assembly by sharing 'CCC in a Box' sessions with 5 smaller groups at 2 schools. Our 'CCC in a Box' sessions help build climate literacy, develop climate oracy, mitigate eco-emotions, and equip our young people to become 'responsible, respectful, active citizens' (Education Inspection Framework)



Earth Day 2025: Our revamped resources, launched on Earth Day 2025 went down a storm - 40 teachers requested links in the first week, and several MPs got in touch to share with schools in their constituencies. The 12 newly-designed sessions include teacher-requested topics, such as: food waste, consumption choices, fast fashion, plastics, biodiversity ... and many more.

Our sessions include a wide range of hands-on activities: quizzes, top trumps, crosswords, snakes and ladders, card games, competitions, 'shopping lists', detective work, dragons den, puzzles ... and every session includes a creative 'take-away' action to share the discussion with the wider community of family and friends.



All Saints CE Primary School, Leeds

Challenges + Certificates



Fun, age-appropriate weekly carbon-busting sustainable-living challenges taking carbon literacy from school into the community.

Beneficiaries	What we have achieved this year
Supporting children aged 7-11yrs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Our weekly challenges/topic-based resources shared with 652 teachers (further shared within schools via newsletters, class dojo pages etc). We received 426 emails from children/families who had completed challenges, we sent each one a personalised reply. Our '3 Little Actions Award' builds sustainable living skills, whilst engendering a sense of teamwork. 64 children received '3 Little Action certificates'. Schools in Reading and Shrivenham also received badges and certificates for challenge engagement via their eco-clubs.

Nelson Primary School, Newham, London: pupils at Nelson are extraordinarily lucky, they have an amazing teacher - Jackie - so goes above and beyond to help them engage with climate action. 62 children from across the school choose to participate in our '3 Little Actions Award', 23 completed over 3 challenges ... and 7 children completed more than 10.

What's next

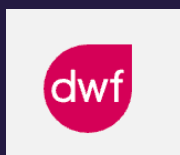
Our 2025/26 aims
