Slide 3 – There’s No Planet B

It’s time for action.

Recent research suggests that if the UK is to meet its carbon reduction target – we, as individuals, will NEED to make changes to the way we do things.

Carbon emissions reductions can’t all be made by changing to low-carbon technologies.

What do you think are some of the reasons why people don’t want to make changes to their lifestyle to help combat climate change?

(Hopefully having joined this Climate Change Club you will now agree that they aren’t good reasons!)

- My friends aren’t doing anything, so why should I?
- Climate Change won’t really matter for quite a few years – we can sort it out then.
- Climate Change won’t really bother us that much in the UK, so I’m not going to get involved.
- I’m sure we’ll be fine – I’m optimistic, it’ll all work out ok.
- We can leave it to the government and businesses – they’ll sort it out.
- There’s no point in me just making little changes, they don’t make any difference.

Discuss with your classmates why these ‘excuses’ aren’t good enough – the slides in this session can be used to help counter each of these points.

Slide 4 – It’s movie time!

The 'RED BUTTON' is on the weekly email and on the website – when you 'HIT' it – it sends a blank email to us to know that you have completed the challenge – we can then count up the number of Young Climate Warriors participating – and count up the difference you are making!

Slide 13 – Tell your friends.

When you have shown your movie in assembly – think about what you can do next to keep everyone in your school motivated to doing things for climate change.

Maybe you could:

- Look at the Young Climate Warriors website with your classmates in form time?
 - Post up the weekly challenge on a notice board or announce it in Friday's assembly?
 - Have a 'red button' competition at school? We can let you know the numbers of people 'hitting the red button'.
 - Share some of the ideas and video clips in this 'Climate Change Club in a Box' – in assembly? In form time? With your School Council?
 - Chat to your friends about the weekly challenges, persuade them to become Young Climate Warriors too?
